

# OFFICIALS' DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

(Revised 1/2001)

This three step officials' program is designed not only to improve the quality of officiating but also to maintain it. Only those working toward assistant ratings will use the application forms contained in the tournament kit packet marked Chief Judge II, or available from USA Water Ski upon request. EP and Open rated skiers may be issued an Assistant Judge rating in each event that an EP or Open rating is held by sending an Assistant Judge Application, with the top portion completed, or a written request **and** a copy of the signed rating card to USA Water Ski's Competition Department.

**Step One - Education:** Educational opportunities through on- and off-water clinics are increasingly available, and officials of all levels are encouraged to take advantage of those listed in our publications. Attendance is mandatory for upgrading ratings and every four years for maintenance purposes. With the exception of aspiring Assistant Drivers, clinics and testing for upgrading may not take place on the same weekend. Please review the Quantitative Requirements sheet printed on the back cover of your Official's Personal Performance Record or enclosed in the Chief Judge II packet of the tournament kit for further details.

**Step Two - Participation:** There are certain quantitative requirements for each rating which must be fulfilled before the official proceeds to the next step. Please note that duties signed off on your application forms of prior years count toward meeting those requirements. Remember to record your work as an official in your Official's Personal Performance Record and have it signed by the appropriate Chief Official. Extra Performance Records are included in all tournament kits (Chief Judge II packet) and available from USA Water Ski upon request. You no longer need to send copies of your work to USA Water Ski unless requested. For judges, work toward rating maintenance and upgrading includes only that performed as Shore Judge, Boat Judge, Meter Reader and Master Board Operator (includes video jump operation). It is also important to verify that your work is accurately listed on the Scorebook's Tournament Officials' Record since this is how your work is credited at USA Water Ski. Annual maintenance requirements are based on a calendar year (i.e., work performed January 1 through December 31, 2001 counts for renewal for 2002).

**Step Three, Part A - Written Evaluation:** Thirty days after having completed the quantitative requirements for your next rating, you may contact USA Water Ski's Competition Department to verify that you have indeed done so and that Headquarters has accurately recorded your work. As applicable, you will be given specific testing instructions and a list of test administrators via a notification letter from Headquarters.

1. **Aspiring Regular Judges and Scorers** will be mailed an open book test, which they have 30 days to complete and return to USA Water Ski's Competition Department for grading. For scorers, this test will also constitute the practical portion of their evaluation.
2. **Aspiring Senior Judges and Scorers** will take a similar open book test, along with a practical test (Step Three, Part B) at a mutually convenient time and place with the test administrator.
3. **Aspiring Assistant Drivers** must complete an Assistant Driver's Application before attending a USA Water Ski/AWSA-sanctioned drivers' clinic for written and practical evaluations. Drivers are not eligible for testing until the application is completely filled out and signed off for the event(s) being applied for. Once the application is completed, the aspiring driver should contact the Regional Drivers' Committee representative or USA Water Ski's Competition Department who will inform them of when and where the nearest clinic is to take place and provide them with a contact. The completed original application should be taken to the clinic and given to the clinic instructor(s) (it is wise to retain a copy for your records).
4. **Aspiring Regular and Senior Drivers** will take the written test at the same time as the practical test (Step Three, Part B-6) during previously designated Class C or higher tournaments. The test will be true-false/multiple choice/fill-in and open book.

**Step Three, Part B - Practical Evaluation:** This final evaluation is designed to simulate tournament conditions as much as possible. Once this phase has been successfully completed, the official will be awarded the rating achieved. No further approvals are necessary. As applicable, you will be given specific testing instructions and a list of test administrators via a notification letter from USA Water Ski.



1. **Aspiring Regular Scorers:** Since a scorer in essence reconciles, computes and records, the take-home test described in Step Three, Part A-1 will constitute both the written and practical portions of the evaluation.
2. **Aspiring Senior Scorers** will take both the written and practical tests described in Step Three, Part A-2 at predetermined sites.
3. **Aspiring Regular Judges**, upon passing the written mail-out test, will be notified by USA Water Ski Headquarters of specific testing instructions and test administrators. The evaluation will be accomplished using a video to assess the official's ability to call trick runs in the 3,000 to 5,000 point range and determine final slalom buoy counts.
4. **Aspiring Senior Judges** will take both the written and practical tests described in Step Three, Part A-2 at once. The latter test is similar, but more difficult, than the one for aspiring regulars (trick runs in the 6,000 to 8,000 point range).
5. **Aspiring Assistant Drivers** will take both the written and practical tests, the latter under the supervision of a panel of three drivers, during a clinic as described in Step Three, Part A-3.
6. **Aspiring Regular and Senior Drivers** will take both the written and practical tests, the latter under the supervision of a panel of three drivers who will evaluate their ability in certain categories such as boat path, driving patterns, skier acceptance and speed maintenance.

Please note that in a given calendar year, an aspiring regular is permitted to take the test on two different test dates, an aspiring senior only once.

The evaluation process has been set up to allow for one, two or three event Assistant, Regular or Senior Judges, Scorers or Drivers.

Once you have successfully completed Step Three, you have achieved the rating you were seeking and will receive written confirmation from USA Water Ski Headquarters. In the meantime, a temporary card, issued at the evaluation site, will allow you to start work at your new rating level immediately.
